Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

I was reading a children's book to my daughter the other day about Easter. In the story the protagonist, a little boy, dyes beautifully colored Easter Eggs with his family. On Easter morning, the Easter Bunny comes and hides the eggs in a wonderful egg hunt around his yard. The egg hunt ends with him finding a great Easter Basket full of chocolate candies and jelly beans. The boy and his family dress up in their fanciest clothes and go to church. At church the boy tries to take off his tie and his sister primps in her Easter hat. There is a brass band and lots of Spring flowers. After church, they have a ham dinner at their grandmother's house.

After I finished the book, I realized it had nothing to do with Easter at all! The story was all about eggs and bunnies and chocolate and fancy clothes. Is that what most people think Easter is all about? Is this what people in our congregation think Easter is about? Don't get me wrong, I love chocolate and I love fancy music ... if I could possibly listen to a brass band play Easter hymns *while* eating a Cadbury Egg, I'd be in heaven. But this has nothing to do with the actual story of Easter.

Easter is not a story about new dresses or baskets or flowers and candy. It's a story about death and bodies and confusion and why God never seems to do what we would like him to.

Think about the story; when Mary Magdalene and the other women travel to that tomb Jesus was buried in, they do so in sadness and confusion. They believed Jesus to be the Messiah, the one to transform the world, the one who will free Israel from the Romans and make everything right. But he died, he was killed, he proved vulnerable just like every other human.

And when Mary Magdalene stood in the doorway to that tomb and saw it was empty, she didn't realize she was witnessing a miracle. She thought Jesus' enemies were so terrible that they stole his body, denied her and the others who loved Jesus of even having his resting place to visit.

And when Mary Magdalene was told by the "gardener" that Jesus was alive, she was confused, worried and wondering if a trick was being played on her. Of course, we know the gardener was Jesus. Mary just didn't recognize him.

As we move into the joyful celebration of Easter, let's remember the Easter story as it really happened. There are no bunnies or chocolates or lilies. Just death, sadness, dirt and blood. Let's remember that no one really knew what was going on and no one recognized Jesus as Jesus until he showed them the wounds in his hands. Let's remember that the disciples were confused, how could Jesus be God and how could Jesus save the world if he was vulnerable enough to die? Let's remember that everything happened exactly the opposite way they expected it to. And let's remember that this is how God chose to reveal himself to the world.

Jesus is revealed as Christ as a man who is weak enough to be killed. Who is willing to be friends with anyone.

Jesus is a God who refused to condemn those who crucified him, who went to the depths of Hell for the people who betrayed him. A God who came back so dirty that he was mistaken for gardener and so covered in blood he could convince others he died.

This is the God who rises to new life. This is what resurrection looks like. Confusion, dirt and blood. I hope you enjoy Easter and I hope you have a beautiful Easter hat to wear and wonderful chocolates to eat and beautiful eggs to find. But I pray that you remember the real Easter story as well and what the story of Jesus is really about.

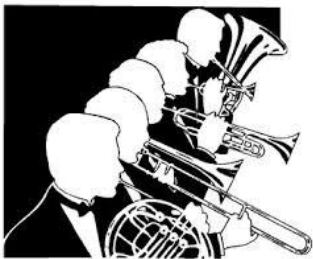

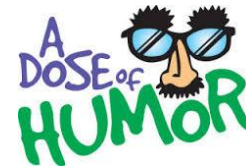

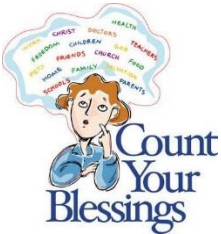

## **WHAT IS HAPPENING AT NETWORKS??**

There are so many incredible things happening at Networks right now! For starters, over the course of the last few months, we've seen another influx of new students. Our middle school program is now averaging 6-8 students each Wednesday, up from 4-6, and our high school group is averaging 16-18 students! Your students earned a TON of compliments and were so incredible on the trip. Everyone was super impressed with how hard they worked and all they accomplished. 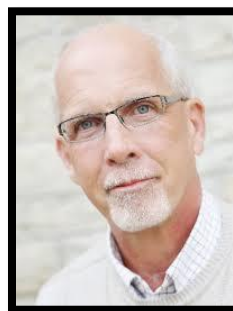
