# August 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This summer as part of our Sunday Morning Prayer Bible Study, we are beginning and ending each week with the same two prayers; The Prayer of St. Francis and The Prayer of St. Patrick. These are two of my favorite prayers and I've enjoyed praying them each week with others. I thought I would highlight and share some of my favorite prayers this month.

The Prayer of St. Francis is also known as the Peace Prayer. It is wrongly thought to have been written by St. Francis of Assisi, however, that misconception was started when the prayer was printed in 1927 under the title "A Prayer of St. Francis". Really, the prayer was first published in a French magazine in 1912 and the author remains unknown. This is a prayer that I started praying when I became a pastor. It reminds me of the great responsibility in my role as a Christian and as a representative of Christ. I have this prayer taped to my computer at work so I can pray it daily in my role as your pastor.

Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; Where there is sadness, joy. Grant that I may not so much seek To be consoled as to console, To be understood as to understand, To be loved as to love; For it is in giving that we receive; It is in pardoning that we are pardoned; It is in dying to self that we are born to eternal life.

St. Patrick's Breastplate Prayer is a popular prayer attributed to one of Ireland's most beloved patron saints. According to tradition, St. Patrick wrote it in 433 A.D. for divine protection before successfully converting the Irish King Leogaire and his subjects from paganism to Christianity. More recent scholarship suggests its author was anonymous. I'm including here the traditional version of the prayer, but when I pray I prefer a reworked version of the prayer.

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down, Christ when I arise, Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me.

Psalm 51 is one of my favorite prayers in the Bible, when David asks God for forgiveness and pardon.

Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.

I first heard the prayer of St. Richard in the movie when it was sort of prayed by the character Greg in the movie "Meet the Parents". Greg, although Jewish, is asked to pray at the dinner with his girlfriend's Christian parents. A stranger version of this prayer is all he can come up with. Even though I had a funny introduction to this prayer, I love this petition to God, also known as the Day by Day prayer.

Thanks be to thee, my <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u>, For all the benefits thou hast won for me, For all the pains and insults thou hast borne for me. O most merciful <u>Redeemer</u>, Friend, and Brother, May I know thee more clearly, Love thee more dearly, And follow thee more nearly: Day by Day.

And lastly, I want to share this prayer from St. Teresa of Avila, who was a Spanish mystic, nun and writer in the 1500s.

Let nothing disturb you, Let nothing frighten you, All things are passing away: God never changes. Patience obtains all things Whoever has God lacks nothing; God alone suffices.

Blessings on your prayer life!

#### "THE JESUS WAY" THE THEME OF VBS



We had а wonderful week of VBS (June 11-15) at Mt. Zion. This year's VBS was a joint effort with two of our fellow **NETworks** churches: First Presbyterian Paul's and St. Episcopal.

The pre-school day camp was from 9-11 am and led by Angie Adams and Carol Gustafson. The VBS day camp for older kids

(entering grades 1-6) ran from 9-4 pm each day and was led by 5 counselors from Luther Point Camp with Pastor Erin overseeing the entire camp week.

More students attended VBS this year than ever before--a total of 67 students (22 in pre-school and 45 in the older group).

Students who attended were from the three churches, and many were visitors from the community.

We had a record number of adult helpers.

Over 75 adults participated by assisting during the week or supporting VBS with meals, snacks, lodging for the counselors, and other things.

Numerous additional Mt. Zion members supported VBS through Change for Change and the other fundraisers that supported VBS.

The students had a full week:

• VBS events began Sunday evening with a sundae bar to welcome counselors and an orientation for volunteers.

Other activities included:

- Tie-dying their own camp shirts
- Bible stories, games, songs, and skits
- Making cookies for Grace Place
- A day of water games
- A cook-out and S'more worship led by the students
- A walk to CCH to lead songs and skits for the residents
