

# Mt. Zion Lutheran Church July 2018 Newsletter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I want to take this opportunity to share with you all a bit about our 2018 synod assembly. The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin gathered together on June 2 and 3 for a weekend of learning, fellowship, doing the yearly business of the synod and the election of a new bishop. Bishop Rick Hoyme, who has served our synod since 2013, is retiring on July 1. I, personally, am very thankful for Bishop Hoyme's leadership and care over the last 5 years and I know you will join with me in wishing him well in his retirement.

The election of a new bishop was of primary concern during the assembly. The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin uses an ecclesiastical ballot, which means that the first ballot is a nomination ballot. Any rostered clergy in the ELCA in good standing can be nominated. In the subsequent ballots we winnow that large nomination ballot down to 7 candidates, to 3, to 2 and then to 1. The candidates are questioned and allowed to speak and are required to fill out a biographical form that includes information about their vision for the future of the synod and the ELCA.

We elected as the next bishop of the Northwest Synod of Wi. Some of you may be familiar with Rev. Skow-Anderson. For the last 5 years she has served on synod staff as our synod's Director of Evangelical Mission. We are excited to welcome Laurie as our next bishop! Laurie will begin serving as bishop on July 2. She will be installed as bishop of our synod on Saturday, August 25, at 2:00 pm at Bethel Highlands, here in Hudson. You are all invited to attend this service!

Lastly, I want to take some time to talk about the theme of our synod assembly. The theme was "Growing Younger". As most of us know average age of the membership of the ELCA is growing older. Churchwide, across our country, we are not attracting young people and young families, therefore as a denomination we are growing older. The theme "Growing Younger" highlights the need for the ELCA and its churches to engage and serve younger generations.

In thinking about this theme, I was reminded of a conversation I had with one of our members a few months ago. I recently shared this conversation with our church council and with the permission of my conversation partner, I'm sharing with you all what we talked about. I hope this gives you all something to think about as we consider the mission of Mt. Zion in the future.

A few months ago, I got into a conversation with a parishioner, who is a mother with young children, about our church and why she doesn't go more often. She told me that getting her kids up and ready for church on Sundays is hard. It's a battle to wake them up, to feed them, to get them clean and dressed. There are fights and crabbiness and complaining. Then when she gets her family to church and the service begins, she is spending her time keeping them under control. She is trying to keep them quiet, keep them from coloring in the hymnals, keep them from crawling under the pews. She is so busy tending them she doesn't hear the sermon, she can't sing the hymns, she can't participate in the liturgy. Sometimes she even gets nasty looks from others around her when her kids are noisy. When church is done she and her family leave, and they feel grumpy, mad at each other and crabby. No one got spiritually fed, no one was able to enjoy the Christian community.

I think a lot of young families have similar problems when worshipping. The question we need to ask ourselves is what can we do, here at Mt. Zion, that will spiritually feed and engage parents and young kids? How can we make Christ available to them in an accessible way that meets their needs?

Our synod assembly talked about this challenge. A challenge not just for us at Mt. Zion, but a challenge for all churches, across the country. What I would like to ask you to do, is to start talking to kids, teenagers, young adults and parents of young kids and ask them about their faith lives. If they are attending a church regularly; ask them what experiences are feeding them spiritually, how the community is helping facilitate their faith life and how church is encouraging them in their Christian call and mission. For those you know who are not attending a church regularly; ask them why not, ask them why churches are not meeting their needs, ask them what they are hungering for, what they need?

Bishop Hoyme asked us the question "?" This is a question for all of us as we consider the future of Mt. Zion.

# BAKE OFF WINNERS -



1st Place - Robin Arneson **SALTED CARAMEL COOKIE DOUGH BILLIONAIRE BARS**THE CRUST:

- 9×13 baking pan
- 1-1lb. roll of Pillsbury Sugar Cookie Dough

# THE CARAMEL LAYER:

- 1(14 oz.) bag of caramels
- ½ cup heavy cream

## THE COOKIE DOUGH LAYER:

- $\frac{3}{4}$  cup  $(1 \frac{1}{2}$  sticks) butter, softened to room temp.
- <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup brown sugar
- 2 tbs. heavy cream
- 1 ½ tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 cup flour
- ½ tsp. salt
- ¾ cup mini semisweet chocolate chips

## THE CHOCOLATE TOP LAYER:

- 1-\(\frac{1}{2}\) cups regular semisweet chocolate chips
- ¼ cup creamy peanut butter
- A sprinkle of Sea Salt

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Grease a 9×13" baking dish with spray and line with parchment.

Press the Cookie Dough evenly down into the pan... Bake it according to the package directions, let it cool & set aside.

While the Cookie crust is baking, combine the caramels and cream in a medium saucepan over low heat. Let melt, stirring occasionally until smooth, about 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, prepare the cookie dough layer. Into a large bowl add the softened butter, brown sugar, flour, salt, cream and vanilla. Mix until it's combined, fluffy and light in color. Stir in the mini chocolate chips.

Pour the caramel layer evenly over the cooled Cookie Crust.

Spread the cookie dough gently over the caramel layer, be careful not to press too hard into the caramel. You want to be sure and keep the two layers separate...

Melt 1-1/2 cups chocolate chips with 1/4 cup peanut butter either in a saucepan, or in the microwave for a few seconds...stirring until combined and smooth! Pour it over the cookie dough layer... Evenly spread the Chocolate over the top, sprinkle the salt...and let it cool completely! Refrigerate for at least one hour before serving.



2<sup>nd</sup> - Place Anna Peterson SOPAPILLA CHEESECAKE BARS

2 cans (8 oz each) Pillsbury™ refrigerated crescent dinner rolls 2 packages (8 oz each) cream cheese, softened 1 ½ cups sugar (Divided) 1 tsp. vanilla ½ cup butter, melted 1 tbsp. ground cinnamon

Heat oven to 350°F.

Unroll 1 can dough. Place in bottom of ungreased 13x9-inch (3-quart) glass baking dish.

Stretch to cover bottom of dish, firmly pressing perforations to seal.

In medium bowl, beat cream cheese and 1 cup of the sugar with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Beat in vanilla. Spread over dough in baking dish.

Unroll second can of dough. Carefully place on top of cream cheese layer. Pinch seams together.

Pour melted butter evenly over top. Mix remaining 1/2 cup sugar with the cinnamon, and sprinkle evenly over butter.

Bake about 30 minutes or until center is set. Cool slightly, about 20 minutes.

Refrigerate for easy cutting. Cover and refrigerate any remaining bars.



3<sup>rd</sup> Place – Mary Stanton **CARAMEL BROWNIES** "An Old Family Recipe"

Buy your favorite boxed Brownie Mix

Follow instruction on the box.

½ way through cooking, drizzled melted caramel over brownies.

When finished baking, drizzled more melted caramel on top.
