We will be purchasing plants from Gertens' Greenhouse again this year.

<u>MARCH 20 –</u> <u>MARCH 27</u>

As we now practice it, Holy Week is the last week of the 40-day season of Lent and the week preceding Easter. In Holy Week we focus on the last week of Christ's life, remembering especially His passion and resurrection.

PALM SUNDAY, MARCH 20 8:15 & 10:30a **Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion**, the first Sunday of Holy Week within the Lenten Season, commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem preceding his passion. As he entered, the people of Jerusalem recognized Jesus as their king, saying "Hosanna to the Son of David; Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

MAUNDY THURSDAY, MARCH 24 7:00p The word "Maundy" is derived from the Latin word for "command." The "Maundy" in Maundy Thursday refers to the command Jesus gave to the disciples at the Last Supper, that they should love and serve one another.

GOOD FRIDAY, MARCH 25 7:00p **Good Friday** is observed on the Friday before Easter Sunday. On this day Christians commemorate the passion, or suffering, and death on the cross of the Lord, Jesus Christ. The biblical account of Jesus' death on the

cross, or crucifixion, his burial and his resurrection, or raising from the dead, can be found in the following passages of Scripture: Matthew 27:27-28:8; Mark 15:16-16:19; Luke 23:26-24:35; and John 19:16-20:30.

EASTER SUNDAY MARCH 27 7:00 & 9:30a On **Easter Sunday**, we celebrate the resurrection of the Lord, Jesus Christ. We believe according to Scripture, that Jesus came back to life, or was raised from the dead, three days after his death on the cross. Through his death, burial and resurrection, Jesus paid the penalty for sin, thus purchasing for all who believe in him, eternal life in Christ Jesus.
