Then the music starts! The entire congregation starts singing. As they sing, everyone stands up and begins to dance in the aisles. We all dance our way up front and place our offering in the basket and then dance our way back to our seats. It felt like a big dance party in the middle of worship!

I remember talking to my Tanzanian friend, Elizabeth, about this practice. "We dance because we don't have much to give, but what we do have, we give with much joy! What a privilege to give back to God!" she said.

This October we are celebrating our annual stewardship season and our annual pledge drive for our 2018 operating budget. Our theme this year is "Abundant J.O.Y. Jesus First, Others Second, Yourself Last".

We want to celebrate Mt. Zion this October and celebrate all the ways that Mt. Zion gives to our members, our community and the world.

If you are interested in providing for Fellowship you would find that it's easy and very much appreciated by everyone who attends Sunday services.


Here are some thoughts for serving:

HUDSON CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY FOOD SHELF – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



The Hudson Christian Community Food Shelf – (Hudson food shelf) operates out of St. Patrick's Catholic Church. It is run by a group of 12 churches

in the Hudson area, with each church taking one month a year to operate the shelf. Mt. Zion's month to operate the food shelf is November. During that month, we need many helping hands to help clients and run the shelf. The rest of the year, we help as needed, sometimes helping with food drives, or donating needed items to the shelf.

The food shelf is open to anyone with a need; the only requirement is that the client lives within the Hudson School District. Clients can come in one time per month, and "shop" the shelves and choose items that their family will eat. Last month, 229 individuals/95 households were served, and 16,950 pounds of food were given away. On average, the food shelf serves 156 adults, 114 children, 38 seniors and distributes more than 16,000 pounds of food a month.

BACKPACK PROGRAM

The Hudson Backpack program is designed to meet the needs of hungry school children at times when school



meals are not enough. All Hudson's private and public elementary schools participate in the program which distributes food to families in need, every other week.

Backpacks are filled with non-perishable, child-friendly, food items for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Also included is a voucher for free milk, eggs and bread from Hudson County Market or Family Fresh.

Mt. Zion partners with the United Methodist Church to provide the backpacks to the children of E.P. Rock.

Green bags are placed in the church commons area one Sunday morning each month. Members and friends of Mt. Zion are encouraged to take home a bag or two, and fill them with the specified groceries and return the filled bags by the following Sunday. If you wish to return the bags early, you may drop them off at the church and put them in the Food Closet in the Nursery.
