

By Corrie Ten Boom

"At one-time Corrie ten Boom would have laughed at the idea that there would ever be a story to tell. For the first fifty years of her life nothing at all out of the ordinary had ever happened to her. She was an old-maid watchmaker living contentedly with her spinster sister and their elderly father in the tiny Dutch house over their shop. Their uneventful days, as regulated as their own watches, revolved around their abiding love for one another. However, with the Nazi invasion and occupation of Holland, a story did ensue.

Corrie ten Boom and her family became leaders in the Dutch Underground, hiding Jewish people in their home in a specially built room and aiding their escape from the Nazis. For their help, all but Corrie found death in a concentration camp. The Hiding Place is their story."

MT. ZION'S BACKPACK MINISTRY



Nearly half of all families that come to food pantries have at least one employed person in the household.

Hunger is a serious concern for many Hudson families and statewide over half a million households do not have enough food for their family members to maintain a healthy active lifestyle. Hungry children are more apt to have poor health, behavioral problems, learning deficiencies and a host of other academic issues.

Mt. Zion partners with the United Methodist Church, the Hudson School District and E.P. Rock Elementary to provide a backpack of food items each Friday throughout the school year to ensure families have enough food to feed their children over the weekend when they don't have access to school food programs. Last year the Backpack Program provided weekend nourishment for 50 EP Rock households every week.

The first backpacks will be delivered to E.P. Rock the week following Labor Day. If you can, please pick up one of the green bags that will be in the fellowship hall and sign your name on the list. The list of required food items is placed inside the bag; the cost is approximately \$10/bag. Also, if you are interested in volunteering to help pack and distribute these backpacks please get in touch with Carol Gustafson (Backpack Coordinator) or Olive Olson (Chair of Mt. Zion's Outreach Committee).

Second Mile Haiti News

In the first 6 months of 2017, the following progress was made at Second Mile:

- 150 individuals were housed for holistic support
- 64 critically ill children had their medical expenses paid
- 16 received physical therapy on site
- 221 graduates returned for 571 follow-up visits
- 46 children recovered from severe acute malnutrition

Now, recognizing that healthy pregnancies result in healthy babies, Second Mile has begun fund raising to build a maternity center to provide prenatal care and birthing services.

Our Second Mile group will meet again on Thursday, September 9. We will get updates, discuss other social justice issues and plan for our fall fundraiser- the annual chili feed on November 8. This year's bead ornament has been fashioned and will be featured at the event.

We had selected Barron County as our Habitat destination this summer, they had plans for a new build, were open to us building the walls, things were moving along great. Then in the middle of June we found out they hadn't yet selected a family and would

not be ready for us on July 31st. So, what do we do? We've got people signed up for those dates; changing

the dates was not an option. A few members of the group called people they knew either with Habitat or other service organizations. Within a couple of weeks, we had a new option in Superior, but if we wanted to build the walls we would need to move quickly. We shifted gears towards a trip to Superior, moved up the wall building date and the walls were delivered by Ed, Gary and Floyd on June 23.





During the week, we had 20 people working at the job site. We finished setting the trusses, sheeted the roof, built the front porch, worked on getting the soffit on the outside and started building the interior walls. Plus, we also helped with a shed at a neighboring Habitat home that was just recently dedicated.

Brandon and Jessica, the soon to be home owners, have two children and Brandon is a double organ transplant recipient. It was an honor to work on their home.

We gave a \$2000 donation to the Habitat chapter and \$500 donation for the family that will go directly to Habitat to help with their down payment.
