FROM PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Heating / Cooling Zones

(Keep the doors closed)

Our church has several heating / cooling zones in it, such as the Fellowship Hall, Commons, Sanctuary, basement and several others. All these areas have separate thermostats to control the areas individually with some being warmer or cooler than others. However, what has been happening is that the doors such as going into the Fellowship Hall and basement are being left open. This causes air from one area to flow into the other area causing one room to lose its cooling or heating, so the HVAC units run a lot more to attempt to maintain the temperature in that zone. So please keep the doors shut when we can, to control the temperatures and our utility bills. It's fine to leave the doors going into the Fellowship Hall, Sanctuary and the basement open during Sunday mornings, but other times help us control our utility bills and keep them closed.

Thermostats

Due to the thermostats being manipulated (intentionally or unintentionally), covers have now been put on all the thermostats and they are now locked. We had a recent incident where the thermostat for the Commons had been changed from cooling to heat and it was trying to heat the Commons to 80 degrees over a weekend. The heater by the back door had also been turned to high. This obviously causes our utility bills to be much higher and the church to be uncomfortable. The timed settings to cool or heat areas have also been cleaned up. If you are in a specific area in the church each week, we can certainly adjust the temperature for you, just please let a Property Committee member know.



Kids' Club's goal is to provide a physically and emotionally safe place for Mt. Zion youth and neighborhood kids to experience the love of God.

Each Wednesday, after school has been dismissed, the kids will be walked from E.P. Rock to Mt. Zion by an adult member of the church. Kids that attend other schools are welcome to attend, but families need to provide their own transportation. KIDS' CLUB MEMBERS will enjoy snacks, games, bible story, music, and lots of laughs.

Parents will need to pick up their kids before 6:00 pm. If you would like to enroll your child or know of a neighborhood child that would like to be included, they will need to fill out a permission slip and return it to the office or Amanda Stojan before their child can attend.

KIDS' CLUB VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are needed to help Kids' Club. Middle schoolers, high schoolers and adults of all ages are welcome to help with small tasks throughout the program. We encourage inter-generational ministry as not all kids have grandparents living nearby. Volunteer Training Meeting will be Wednesday Sept 12 4pm-5pm.

Student volunteers are highly encouraged to attend. Mt. Zion would like 2 adults in the building during regular programming for accountability in case of an emergency. In the past, sometimes this was Pastor working in her office or Mary Kay leading junior choir. However, their schedules do not always overlap with Kids' Club. We understand that Kids' Club is too much motion and commotion for some adults; in which case, please consider being an extra adult within the building on the rare nights we are short. MT. ZION'S BACKPACK MINISTRY



Nearly half of all families that come to food pantries have at least one employed person in the household. Hunger is a

serious concern for many Hudson families and statewide over half a million households do not have enough food for their family members to maintain a healthy active lifestyle. Hungry children are more apt to have poor health, behavioral problems, learning deficiencies and a host of other academic issues.

Mt. Zion partners with the United Methodist Church, the Hudson School District and E.P. Rock Elementary to provide a backpack of food items each Friday throughout the school year to ensure families have enough food to feed their children over the weekend when they don't have access to school food programs. Last year the Backpack Program provided weekend nourishment for 50 EP Rock households every week.

The first backpacks will be delivered to E.P. Rock the shortly after Hudson returns to school. If you can, please pick up one of the green bags that will be in the fellowship hall and sign your name on the list.

The list of required food items is placed inside the bag; the cost is approximately \$10/bag. Also, if you are interested in volunteering to help pack and distribute these backpacks please get in touch with Carol Gustafson (Backpack Coordinator) or Lynell Nemitz (Chair of Mt. Zion's Outreach Committee).

UPDATE ON PASTORAL TRANSITION PROCESS
