Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A couple years ago I read an article in "Real Simple" magazine about a gardening group. On Friday mornings from April through September there is a group of women who call themselves the "Wonder Weeders" in Woodstock, New York. This group of women sets aside one morning a week to garden together. They rotate where they garden each week so each women's property gets benefit.

The group started because one member shattered her knee. While she recovered, she was unable to take care of her beloved rose garden. A neighbor offered to come over to help and over the summer the two women became friends around their shared love of gardening. The next summer they invited more people to join their group and the Wonder Weeders was born.

The women share gardening expertise and skills and they also share of themselves, talking and visiting while gardening and supporting each other through difficult times and celebrating during joyful times. One of the members died of cancer and after her death the Wonder Weeders descended upon her house and tended the garden until it was breathtaking. The funeral reception was held in the garden, and the Wonder Weeders picked fruit from the fruit trees in the garden to make pots of jam to give to people who attended the funeral.

The women said that over the years they have gotten more than just improved gardens. One woman commented "This group taught me how to lean on other people." Eventually, the women started venturing outside their own gardens, offering their services to community gardens and teaching children about gardening.

As I read this story, I thought about our church community and what our church is for us. Like the Wonder Weeders we are bound together through community and shared work. Through our worship and service, we get to know each other,

become family to each other and support each other through ups and downs. We learn it's ok to lean on each other and we learn to reach out with each other's support and love.

The difference of Mt. Zion and the Wonder Weeders is that we are bound together through the gospel of Jesus Christ. We are bound together by the shared past of a God who is parent to us all and by the hope of the future promises of forgiveness and eternal life.

Let us remember both the joys of service together, the things that bind us to each other, the strength of the relationships we share and let us also remember that our congregation is more than a mere club. We are bound together through ties that cannot be broken.
