Today's psalm is one that I find so beautiful and reassuring. It outlines the way that God shows up for us, and encourages us with a holy peace and power when we worship and lean on God. These words of praise, of God's love and action in our world provide me with a connection to the Spirit that really empowers and lifts me up - I hope that this psalm provides that sense of empowerment and being uplifted to you too. For truly with God, and through God's steadfast love, all things are possible.

So here is today's psalm, Psalm 138.

I give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart; before the gods I sing your praise;

- 2 I bow down toward your holy temple and give thanks to your name for your steadfast love and your faithfulness; for you have exalted your name and your word above everything.[a]
- 3 On the day I called, you answered me, you increased my strength of soul.[b]
- 4 All the kings of the earth shall praise you, O Lord, for they have heard the words of your mouth.
- 5 They shall sing of the ways of the Lord, for great is the glory of the Lord.
- 6 For though the Lord is high, he regards the lowly; but the haughty he perceives from far away.
- 7 Though I walk in the midst of trouble,
 you preserve me against the wrath of my enemies;
 you stretch out your hand,
 and your right hand delivers me.
 8 The Lord will fulfill his purpose for me;
- your steadfast love, O Lord, endures forever.

 Do not forsake the work of your hands.

We pray too, O Lord, that they may find sufficient and holy rest, that they may be renewed in their spirits in the ways that bring them joy, that they may have the tangible necessities to provide for themselves and their families, and that by your Holy Spirit, they may have the strength to carry on. God we pray for all people involved in academia, for teachers, administrators, and all school staff that have to make impossible choices for this upcoming academic year. May they too find holy and sufficient rest, have the ability to keep themselves and their families healthy and as close to thriving as possible, and the strength to carry on in the midst of the unknown and downright scary situations they often face. Lord we pray for students of all kinds, that their curiosity and desire to know more may be satisfied in ways that keep them healthy and fulfilled. You deliver us in the midst of trouble, O Lord, and we call upon that deliverance for all of us in the midst of this pandemic crisis. We know you are faithful and steadfast in your love, O Lord, and may that faithfulness continue to bring us joy and comfort in the midst of all this trouble.
