Hello everyone! And welcome to our Wednesday Word devotion for today, Wednesday, July 29, 2020. Thank you so much for tuning in, and taking this time out of your day to focus on God and focus on your faith.

I wanted to note today that the Wednesday Word devotions may look a little different moving forward. We've been following a format that's pretty similar for the last few months, and with summer coming to a close (can you believe that?!) and the program year starting up again, it seemed like a good idea to try some new things out and see how they go.

So for today, I'm going to lead us in two spiritual practices that are rooted solely in the Word. I'm going to read a beautiful psalm, and lead us in a time of prayer. This video will be shorter than previous devotions, but I hope that the time we spend here today will fill your cup, and you can always come back and watch again. So our Psalm for today is Psalm 145 - a praise psalm, written by King David.

- 1 I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever.
- 2 Every day I will bless you, and praise your name forever and ever.
- 3 Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; his greatness is unsearchable.
- 4 One generation shall laud your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.
- 5 On the glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate.
- 6 The might of your awesome deeds shall be proclaimed, and I will declare your greatness.
- 7 They shall celebrate the fame of your abundant goodness, and shall sing aloud of your righteousness.
- 8 The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.
- 9 The Lord is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made.
- 10 All your works shall give thanks to you, O Lord, and all your faithful shall bless you.
- 11 They shall speak of the glory of your kingdom,

and tell of your power,

12 to make known to all people your mighty deeds, and the glorious splendor of your kingdom.

13 Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and your dominion endures throughout all generations.

The Lord is faithful in all his words, and gracious in all his deeds.

- 14 The Lord upholds all who are falling, and raises up all who are bowed down.
- 15 The eyes of all look to you, and you give them their food in due season.
- 16 You open your hand, satisfying the desire of every living thing.
- 17 The Lord is just in all his ways, and kind in all his doings.
- 18 The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth.
- 19 He fulfills the desire of all who fear him; he also hears their cry, and saves them.
- 20 The Lord watches over all who love him, but all the wicked he will destroy.
- 21 My mouth will speak the praise of the Lord, and all flesh will bless his holy name forever and ever.
